# **Behaviour**

Northmead is a well-disciplined school and the children are taught to be polite, cheerful and respectful. We praise and reward good attitude and behaviour.

We have discussed this year's newest version of our school rules; Be ready, be respectful and be safe.

We have a very clear behaviour policy which is explained to and understood by all children.

Parents will be notified if their child has been removed from class or if their child is continually causing disruption in lessons.

# Marble Treat

In year 4 we run a marble treat system. Each class receives a marble in recognition of excellent team work or behaviour. When they have earned 30 marbles, the class is rewarded with a treat which they have voted for.

# <u>Maths</u>

We are continuing to develop our maths teaching inspired by the Singapore and Shanghai approaches. In our lessons, children are encouraged to physically represent mathematical concepts. Objects and pictures are used to demonstrate and visualise abstract ideas, alongside numbers and symbols. Mathematical concepts are explored in a variety of representations and problem-solving contexts to give pupils a richer and deeper learning experience.

# **Times Tables**

At Northmead we have a scheme to encourage children to learn their multiplication tables. It is important children can quickly and accurately recall their multiplication tables. Our scheme consists of weekly tests. Children will have 48 questions to complete in 4 minutes. Once they passed three times, they will move on to the next level. Pupils will be awarded certificates as they pass each tables test. Once children are ready, they will be entered into the star test. If these tests are passed, a star badge can be purchased from the school office at the cost of £1.

These tests, along with TTRockstars practice, will help prepare the children for the times tables test conducted at the end of the year, when all year 4 children are expected to know all of their tables up to 12x12.



# <u>English</u>

Reading sessions allow your child to improve both their reading accuracy and their comprehension. Children read daily and the teacher will also read aloud to the class every day.



Once initial assessments have been undertaken, children will take part in a daily spelling lesson using a scheme called 'The Oxford Read Write Inc'.

In English this year, each term includes a fiction and non-fiction unit of work, which is built around a model text. In fiction, we use a specific extract from a book, and the children focus on extending their vocabulary and learning to write using the language and structure of the text as the guide. In non-fiction, we use a Pie Corbett approach to writing, where the children imitate the language they need for a particular topic before reading and analysing it and then writing their own version.

# Accelerated Reader

In Year 4 we will continue to use the Accelerated reader reading scheme. Accelerated Reader is a system used to promote children's reading skills and enjoyment. Children are assessed to determine their reading ability and can then choose from a range of recommended titles at their reading level. The children will be told which 'colour' band they are reading.

Children can choose a book of their colour, from their classroom, that they will then have the opportunity to change regularly. They will then bring these books home and keep them at home until they have finished reading them. Once they have finished a book, they complete an online quiz in school to check that they have read and understood it. For every quiz successfully passed the children will receive a raffle ticket. This ticket is entered into the draw to win prizes at the end of the term. All books will be quarantined before being given to other children.

# **Presentation**

At Northmead, we expect all children to take pride in their work. They must write in legible, joined handwriting during every lesson. Children are expected to neatly underline the date and learning intention with a ruler.

# **Trips and Visitors**

# <u>Homework in Year 4</u>

We successfully used Google Classroom as a home learning platform last year and are keen to use this to provide homework this year. We will start expecting homework to be submitted by w/b 21<sup>st</sup> September 2020 and hope you can use September as an opportunity to try out the systems.

Your children's login details are the same as they were previously. New class codes have been sent out.

English and maths homework will be sent home on alternate weeks. All homework will be posted on a Thursday and expected to be completed by the following Tuesday.

Please be aware you must login with the child's Northmead account for safeguarding purposes.

# **Reading**

Your child needs to read 3 times a week to an adult for 10–15 minutes, this should include some discussion and questioning time. We will expect to see evidence of these reads submitted on Google Classroom each week on a Monday. To complement the physical books, which will be limited due to quarantining, you are very welcome to read home books and have access to a wide library of books using Oxford Owl. # **Spellings**

Each week, **on a Friday**, a new spelling sheet will be uploaded to Google Classroom. Children will need to practice these spellings and "turn in" evidence of their practice the following Friday.

# <u>Maths</u>

Your child is expected to learn their multiplication tables. On Google Classroom, you will have access to a range of 'home' sheets for your child to work through each day. **Please submit the assignment when your child has completed their daily practices for the week**. Children are tested weekly on the table they are currently working on and the score will be shared weekly on Google

Classroom. The test consists of 48 questions and they have 4 minutes to complete. If they pass 3 times, then they move on to the next table. We encourage using lots of online games and apps including 'Hit The Button' and 'Timestable Rock Stars'. Please comment on the Google Classroom assignment if your child's TTRS does not match their current table and we will update it for you.





# **Topic Homework**

Each half term we will provide an open ended project based on an area of the curriculum that we are learning about. The first project will be set after the October half term break. These projects will be shared as pictures/powerpoints/presentations online on Google Classroom when they are due.

# **Physical Education**

PE lessons take place on a **Wednesday** afternoon and currently children are asked to wear their PE kit into school on a Wednesday. Children are not allowed to wear earrings during PE so please make sure your child is able to take these out on their own.

# <u>Music</u>

As we are not allowed to sing or play wind instruments at school currently we are adapting the music curriculum to focus on percussion, rhythm and listening and appraising at the beginning of the year. To compliment this we can give you free access to a fantastic programme called Charanga where we have loaded several signing courses and lessons to learn keyboard, guitar, fiddle or recorder.
