We would love children to keep reading over the summer.

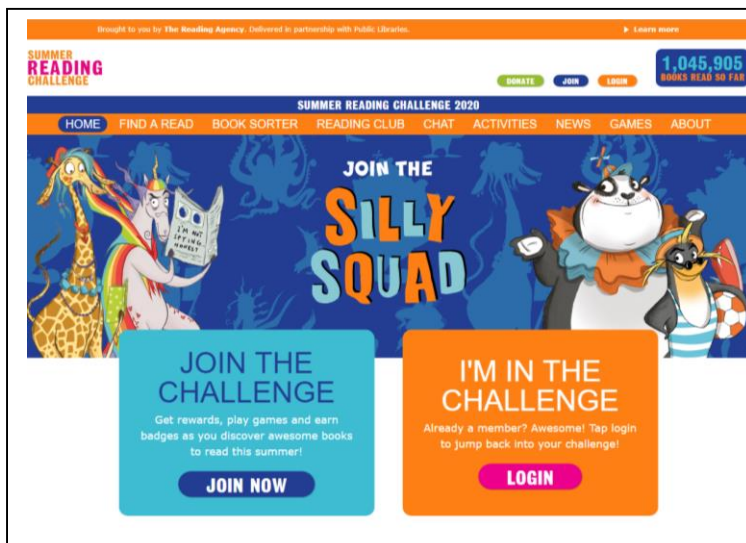
There are a range of challenges children can take part in.

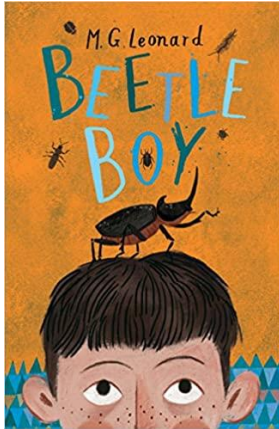


This Summer Reading Bingo is an activity for children you may like to try over the summer holidays. The focus is on reading for pleasure experiences rather than specific texts

What is the story about?

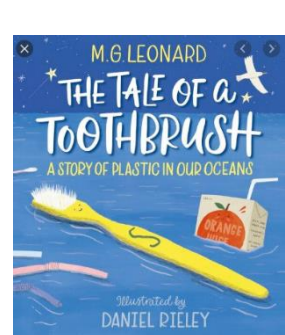

The book tells the story of their friendship and how they try to defeat the mad-scientist of the fashion world, Lucretia Cutter, a villainess with an alarming interest in insects.
