The six books shortlisted for the 2021 Blue Peter Book Awards have been announced. These awards are judged by school children across the country.


The winning titles, voted for by children from 12 schools across the UK, will be revealed live on Blue Peter on Thursday 4th March.

This applies to children learning at home or in school. We look forward to seeing your creations.





Northmead's Online Book Club

What is it?

The University of Surrey's Widening Participation and Outreach (WPO) team invite your child to join The Book Quest.

The Book Quest encourages reading for pleasure. To become a Literary Legend, students will need to read the chosen book over a 4-week period and interact with an activity workbook. They will have the chance to read books and complete optional expeditions that will bring the book to life.

We invite you to enrol your child onto our Years 5 and 6 Book Quest. Once their place is confirmed we will send you the book and workbook so that they can begin their quest!

The quest will begin on the 8th March 2021.

The Book Quest is targeted at pupils who meet one or more of the university's widening participation criteria including those eligible for free school meals, young carers or care-experienced young people.


Who is the author?
