Starting from 10th July, Surrey Libraries are launching the summer of reading. Join the free Summer Reading Challenge at Guildford library, help six Wild World Adventurers and become an environmental hero!

Organised by the Reading Agency, the theme this year is **Wild World Heroes**, and has been developed in partnership with WWF UK, the world's leading independent conservation organisation. This year's Challenge will be a celebration of reading, nature and action for the environment. Wild World Heroes will inspire children to stand up for the future of our planet.

Designed for all reading abilities, children can choose whatever books, audiobooks, comics, ebooks or eAudiobooks they like to complete the Challenge.

Every participant receives stickers and other incentives along the way. Those children who read or listen to six books are presented with a personalised certificate and a golden medal.
