

We have been able to return to lower and upper school assemblies as well as children eating together in the dining hall and year groups being able to play together at break and lunch times. What does unity look like?


Who shows unity?

Early Risers Club SAK

Sport4Kids are delighted to confirm that the S4K Early Risers Club will be returning to Stoughton Infant School from Thursday 6th January 2022! Parents/Guardians will be able to let S4K coaches know each day whether they would like their son/daughter to receive a healthy and nutritious breakfast served by the S4K team. Each morning, cereal (non-sugary) and toast with spread (jam or marmite) will be available as part of the S4K Early Risers Club. There is no additional cost for this extra service. The club runs between 7:50am and 8.50 am, aimed at children from all year groups. We cover a variety of sports, including Football, Tennis, Cricket, Rugby, Basketball and even Futsal (Brazilian football), as well as energetic active games!



Update

From Monday 17th January, people who are self-isolating with COVID 19 will have the option to reduce their isolation period after 5 full days if they test negative with a lateral flow device (LFD) test on both day 5 and day 6 and they do not have a temperature.

For example, if they test negative on the morning of day 5 and the morning of day 6, they can return to school immediately on day 6.

The day of the positive test is day 0 and the first test must be taken no earlier than day 5 of the self-isolation period and the second must be taken the following day, 24 hours afterwards. All test results should be reported to NHS Test and Trace. This includes the initial positive result which resulted in the isolation. https://www.gov.uk/report-covid19-result?utm-source=14%20January%202022%20C19&utm-medium=Daily%20Email%20C19&utm-campaign=DfE%20C19
If the result of either of their tests is positive, they should continue to self-isolate until they get negative results from two LFD tests on consecutive days or until they have completed 10 full days of self-isolation, whichever is earliest. Anyone who is unable to take LFD tests or anyone who continues to have a temperature will need to complete the full 10-day period of self-isolation.
