

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Dear Parents and Carers,

I am pleased to say our number of Covid cases in school continues to fall again. We currently have 11 cases, and we are continuing to carefully monitor the numbers daily. 






Year 3 – Wisley Visit

Animal update





Update

From Monday 17th January, people who are self-isolating with COVID 19 will have the option to reduce their isolation period after 5 full days if they test negative with a lateral flow device (LFD) test on both day 5 and day 6 and they do not have a temperature.

For example, if they test negative on the morning of day 5 and the morning of day 6, they can return to school immediately on day 6.

The day of the positive test is day 0 and the first test must be taken no earlier than day 5 of the self-isolation period and the second must be taken the following day, 24 hours afterwards. All test results should be reported to NHS Test and Trace. This includes the initial positive result which resulted in the isolation. https://www.gov.uk/report-covid19-result?utm source=14%20January%202022%20C19&utm me dium=Daily%20Email%20C19&utm campaign=DfE%20C19
If the result of either of their tests is positive, they should continue to self-isolate until they get negative results from two LFD tests on consecutive days or until they have completed 10 full days of self-isolation, whichever is earliest. Anyone who is unable to take LFD tests or anyone who continues to have a temperature will need to complete the full 10-day period of self-isolation.
