Message from our Chair of Governors

Last month saw the inaugural national school governors' awareness day. Do you know what governors do and who your governors at Northmead are?

What we do: As school governors we provide strategic leadership to the school, holding school leaders to account for the outcomes and pastoral care of students and make sure the school's money is spent for the benefit of the pupils and also liaise with our academy trust.

Who we are: In addition to the head teacher Debbie Brown and the deputy head Denise Lewis we currently have 6 non-staff governors.

Our two parent governors both joined in 2021. Debbie Gooch is our new SEND governor. She is a parent of a child in Year 4 (and also has a child in Year 1 at Stoughton) and works as a lecturer in Developmental Psychology at the University of Surrey where she runs a module in Psychology and Education. Dan Little is a company director and commercial pilot with a daughter in year 5. He also coaches youth rugby and will be our new PE link governor.

Charlotte Lacey and Sarah Fothergill both joined in 2019 as community governors. Charlotte is a strategy consultant who specialises in conducting research and strategy projects for schools. She has three children who are all at the later stages of their education.

Sarah works as a Head of Finance for a defence company and is our health and safety governor and vice chair.

Mike Cubitt joined in 2014 as a community governor and is a retired CFO and has been our finance link governor for the last 8 years. I first joined the Governing Body in Dec 2013 as a parent governor becoming Chair of Governors in July 2018 (my daughters are now in secondary school/sixth form). I work as an academic in the Physics Department at the University of Surrey being involved in research, project management and teaching.

Music Rehearsals for G-Live







As you will be aware the government announced their plans for Living with COVID-19. The DFE have outlined the changes for schools and we wanted to communicate these to you. The changes were effective from **Thursday 24th February 2022.**

Obviously, the changes are significant adjustments to the way that we have been operating in school but please be advised that we are following government guidance and the local schools in our trust are also updating information for parents and carers. We are sure that many of you will welcome these changes and we hope that it will feel closer to normality for children and adults in our community.

The key messages from the information that has been shared with us are outlined below;

- Children and staff should stay home if they are unwell and displaying symptoms, e.g. high temperature or persistent cough. Lateral flow tests will no longer be available free of charge from 1st April 2022.
- Have a PCR test if you have COVID-19 symptoms, stay home and avoid contact with other people. If you
 test positive isolate for at least 5 full days, then continue to follow the guidance until you receive 2
 negative lateral flow tests on consecutive days.
- Continue to ventilate classrooms.
- Wash hands regularly and follow the advice to "Catch it, Bin it, Kill it".
- Staff are no longer be required to undertake twice weekly lateral flow tests.
