Safeguarding – On line Safety

We have become aware that some of our pupils are using **Discord** for chatting online with friends.

Please be aware that this platform requires users to be at least 13 years old. This is as it has open chat and, as it is user-generated, allows inappropriate content. Users may share images and engage in voice chat. It also has channels that require users to be 18+ but it is easy to click through the verification.

If you are using Discord and do not want to be exposed to age-restricted content, you can turn on the explicit media content filter in your privacy settings. In your *User Settings*, select *Privacy & Safety*, and choose '*Keep me safe*' under *Safe Direct Messaging*. Choosing "Keep me safe" will ensure that images and videos in all direct messages are scanned by Discord and explicit media content is blocked.

History may be in the past and a lot of what we study at Northmead is thousands of years old, but it is not dead! Exciting trips to museums and places of historical interest, from Butser ancient farm to the British Museum, and visitors in fancy dress with a wealth of historical resources, bring the periods we study to life. My name is Alastair Kemp and I am the History subject leader at Northmead. Welcome to the **<u>HISTORY</u>** subject section of the newsletter.

An understanding of history helps us understand our place in the world today. Without an understanding of the past, we have no understanding of what has shaped the way we are in the present and are left blindly stumbling into the future. At Northmead, we aim to instil a love for the study of history with an understanding that it is an integral part of who we are. We want children to know key events from the past and be able to reflect on the impact of history on society today. We want children, at their level, to be able to evaluate and interrogate sources and to judge their value and reliability. Above all, we want children to leave Northmead with an awareness of a broad range of historical events and periods; to be able to place those events chronologically; to value the impact history has on us today and to find pleasure in studying the past.

Year 3 children learn about the earliest days of civilisation as we know it as the **Stone Age** moved into the **Iron Age** and study the fascinating millennium old **Maya** culture of central America.

Year 4 immerse themselves in the ancient world of the **Egyptians** – toilet roll mummification is always entertaining! - and one of the most powerful empires of them all, the **Romans**, and in particular the Romani impact on Britain. In **Year 5**, following on from the end of the Roman Empire, children discover more about two groups of settlers who chose Britain: the **Anglo Saxons** and the **Vikings**. Year 5 also learn about the rich and varied history of **Guildford**. Did you know that Guildford castle his invasion in 1066?

In **Year 6** the children return to another ancient civilisation, this time the **Greeks**, with a focus on how events nearly 2500 years ago can, incredibly, have an impact on life today. Were you aware that the concept of democracy, something we take for granted in the UK in the 21st century, was first introduced in ancient Athens? Year 6 also follow a fascinating thematic study looking at the **changing power of the monarchy** since 1066.

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Developmental Language Disorder Awareness Day 14th October 2022

Developmental Language Disorder (DLD) is a hidden but common disability that affects 1 in 14 people causing difficulties understanding and using language for no known reason.



Northmead's COIN Centre provides specialist provision for pupils with DLD who have been placed in this setting by The Local Education Authority. Centre staff also provide support and advice to mainstream teachers with identifying and making provision for mainstream based pupils with the condition.

The 2022 DLDday theme is *Growing with DLD*, highlighting that DLD is a lifelong, permanent disability. People do not grow out of DLD but with individualised support that can include regular speech-language therapy and educational adjustments, they can thrive. It's about growing with DLD.

People with DLD are 6 times more likely to suffer from anxiety and 3 times more likely to have clinical depression. They are also at significant risk of struggling with reading, spelling and mathematics.

DLD is often referred to as 'the hidden learning disability' as symptoms are often misunderstood and misinterpreted.
