
Reading was a key focus during our recent Ofsted inspection. The Ofsted inspector conducted what is called a 'deep dive' in reading. This was a thorough investigation and analysis of our reading offer at Northmead. To form her opinion, the inspector visited

classes during their reading lessons, listened to children reading to their teachers, observed story-time, toured the school, and talked to children, teachers and leaders.

Our children talked with great enthusiasm about their reading and it was evident that we have developed a positive reading culture in the school. We were pleased that this was noted in the final report which stated; Leaders prioritise the teaching of reading. They want to inspire pupils to love reading and to read well. Teachers use carefully chosen, high-quality texts to teach comprehension and extend pupils' vocabulary.








Wow! Thank you so much for your purchases at our recent book fair.

When given this title Joseph released this statement:


